Each summer the Alberta Teachers' Association hosts a week-long Educational Leadership Academy for school leaders that is specifically crafted to allow those participating to enter into a rich and deep learning experience that will change their leadership practice in profound ways.

This year, the Academy will take place at the St. Anthony Learning Centre in Edmonton from Monday, July 8 to Friday, July 12. The cost is \$150 + GST which covers the program, as well as breakfast, morning and afternoon coffee breaks and lunch each day. Space is limited!

This year's Academy is focused on Instructional Leadership and will be led by Dr. Ryan Dunn (Lecturer at the Melbourne University and Director at Agile Schools). This program is a "must" for school and district leaders who want to grow in their capacity to provide instructional leadership and to lead a learning community.

ABOUT DR. RYAN DUNN



Dr. Ryan Dunn has considerable experience within education and has advised and collaborated with schools and districts across the USA and Australia. During his extensive work in the United States he led large-scale research and professional learning initiatives in New York City and California, and in Australia was a lead consultant within the ‘Curiosity and Powerful Learning’ initiative that worked with over 100 primary and secondary schools across Victoria and Queensland.

More recently, Ryan is a lecturer at the University of Melbourne where his work focuses on teacher professional learning, educational leadership, practitioner research and primary mathematics. He is the Director of the Maths Collaborative that is a partnership between the Maths Association of Victoria, Melbourne University and 40 primary schools. As a speaker, Ryan has delivered keynotes for the University of Melbourne Network of Schools on topics such as: Leading Improvement, Professional Learning Teams and Mathematical Reasoning.

Ryan completed his PhD under the supervision of Professor John Hattie. His PhD focused on the effectiveness of educational design research as a form of teacher professional learning. He is a lead facilitator for Learning Sprints and Agile Leadership programs across Australia.
