This is a rally for better learning and working conditions for students and teachers.

The rally has nothing to do with political ideology or affiliation and everything to do with being a member of the teaching profession.

There are 46,000 teachers in this province, and together we are leading this rally for a stronger public education system.

As previously mentioned, the ATA and this rally are both non-partisan. The intent of this rally is simply to raise awareness of the issues surrounding public education.

This is a family friendly event....there will be entertainers, food trucks, face painters, a place for kids to make their own sign, as well as portable toilets and access to the bathrooms in the Visitor Centre.

We would LOVE to see as many of you there as possible, as this is a chance for us to come together, support one another and public education! Teachers from all over the province will be in attendance, as well as parents, members of the public and other public sector workers.

As a little bit of enticement the Local is also offering some \$50 gift cards for members that attend and take/post a selfie at the rally, tagging the Local and using the hashtag #StandForEducation.

(Winners will be drawn randomly from all that enter.)

Lastly, in preparation for the rally the Local is hosting a sign/poster making evening at Barnett House (11010 142 Street) THIS WEDNESDAY (tomorrow) in Room 213, 4:30-8:30pm.

- 3. If media approach you, please remember that you are participating in an event organized for all Alberta teachers, parents, grandparents and community members, but you could easily be viewed as a spokesperson for all teachers.
- 4. We are professionals demonstrating our professional concern for the education of our students. If hecklers are present, please ignore them; don't stoop to their level.
- 5. If you spot an MLA at the rally, please treat them with courtesy and respect.

6. Remember to be respectful and professional when posting about the rally on social media. You can use the tag #standforeducation.

7. In order to accommodate all participants, private vehicles will not be allowed on the Legislature grounds. Please help us move participants as quickly and efficiently as possible by leaving your private vehicle at one of the designated park-and-ride sites and taking a chartered Edmonton Transit bus.


